# What is 'TOSSD.online' and how to use it?

## What is TOSSD.online?

It is the TOSSD data visualisation tool. It permits to access the data in a powerful, yet easy to use, manner. Users can filter the data, produce alternate visualisation options, download charts, and export the activity level data with all the available details.

## How to use TOSSD.online in 7 steps

1. Select relevant filters (Pillar, recipient country (click on “Action to filter by country or region), sector, year)
2. Click on “Apply selection”
3. Select the data visualisation chart by pillar, sector (CRS or ISIC), recipient (chart or map), SDG goals and targets
4. Click on “Browse activities”
5. Click on “Export activities” and download in excel, pdf or xml
6. Click on “Action” and “reset filters” or “see my selection”
7. Click on “TOSSD.org main site” and “About”



Make sure development co-operation is aligned with recipient countries' priorities for sustainable development


## Identify the various SDG priorities of providers (1/2)

1. Select relevant filters: all pillars, Bangladesh as recipient country, all sectors and a year.
2. Use the data visualisation to view the repartition by SDG goal and target.

**Findings:** Providers prioritise goal 9 and 11.




Which SDG targets do providers focus on in Bangladesh?

**TOSSD at a glance**

TOSSD is a new international statistical framework for monitoring official resources and private finance mobilised by official interventions in support of sustainable development. It is designed to monitor both cross-border resources (Pillar I) and support to international public goods and global challenges (Pillar II). TOSSD includes both concessional and non-concessional support, from multilateral and bilateral finance providers, including South-South and triangular co-operation providers.

HOME WHAT IS TOSSD INTERNATIONAL TASK FORCE PILOT STUDIES EVENTS RESOURCES DATA

The International TOSSD Task Force is an inclusive group of experts from provider countries, recipient countries and multilateral organisations that has been collectively developing TOSSD since 2017. The International TOSSD Task Force makes all documents publicly available, fully respecting the recommendation of the Addis Ababa Action Agenda that, in July 2015, called for the development of TOSSD in an "open, inclusive and transparent manner". This page provides details of the International TOSSD Task Force members, the meetings held, the documents discussed and the decisions taken.

**Highlights from the 12<sup>th</sup> Task Force meeting**

The 12th International Task Force meeting took place virtually on 9 and 11 March 2021. At the meeting, the TOSSD Task Force Secretariat presented members the first TOSSD dataset and the updated website. Members discussed key strategic objectives and activities to promote the TOSSD framework and the use of TOSSD data in 2021. They also discussed a proposal to develop a basic manual of procedures for the Task Force. The TOSSD Task Force Secretariat updated members on the work of the IAEG-SDGs working group on measurement of development support.

**What does the International TOSSD Task Force do?**

The International TOSSD Task Force was created in July 2017 and currently has 29 members and 5 observers. The participants are statistical and development policy experts from provider countries, recipient countries and multilateral organisations. The International TOSSD Task Force established the first version of the TOSSD methodology in 2019, illustrated in the document "TOSSD Reporting Instructions", and continues to work on its further development.

For these processes, the International TOSSD Task Force consults experts on specific issues for example on peace & security and communicable diseases. The Civil Society community also participates in the Task Force as an observer.

# Use TOSSD data for the Global Compact on Refugees (GCR)

TOSSD is recognised as an official data source for five indicators of the GCR Indicator Framework



TOSSD is a unique data source to collect data on the support of refugees in a systematic manner.

Data on the support for refugees are only captured from reporters to the ODA system through ad-hoc surveys.

Additionally, TOSSD can provide data on sustainable reintegration of refugees in the economy and culture of the provider country.

The tool helps to get a first overview of the data. For further analysis, data can be exported to Excel, SML or PDF.

**TOSSD data are useful for a variety of data users:** recipient countries, multilateral institutions, media/journalists, providers, CSOs, think tanks, academics, data analysts and specific communities (e.g. people working on support to refugees).

**TOSSD data can fill a variety of information needs:**

development planning, SDG monitoring, analysis of TOSSD flows, SDG monitoring, etc.
